'Worship itself, Eucharistic communion, includes the reality both of being loved and of loving others in return. A Eucharist which does not pass over into the concrete practice of love is intrinsically fragmented....'
- Pope Benedict

One of the key teachings on the Eucharist in the writings of Saint Paul is the need we have to live the full meaning of Eucharist in our daily lives if we are not to 'eat and drink condemnation.' Pope Benedict writes about the essential link between the Eucharist and Charity. When our 'entire lives' are 'animated' by charity the Eucharist is bearing fruit. Pope Francis builds on this link, when he asks -


....in adoring Christ who is really present in the Eucharist: do I let myself be transformed by him? Do I let the Lord who gives himself to me, guide me to going out ever more from my little enclosure, in order to give, to share, to love him and others?' - Pope Francis

Let us pray thanks for the myriad ways charity, grounded in the Eucharist, animates our Parish of Our Lady of Kāpiti and our local Church of Wellington.
